You will be required to read two novels this summer:

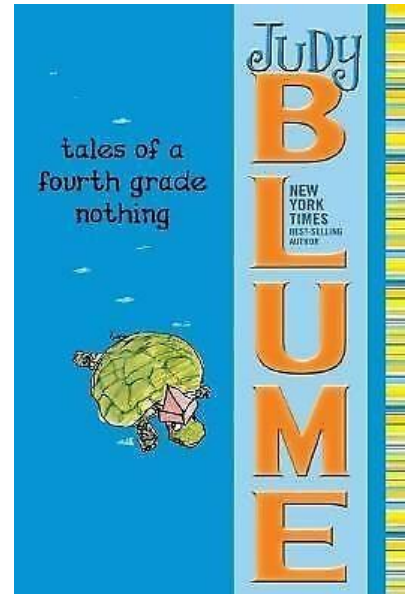
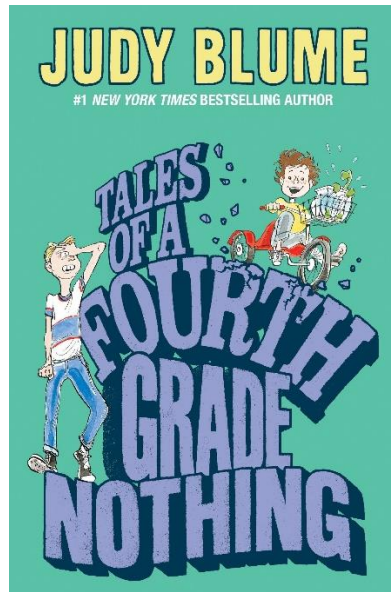
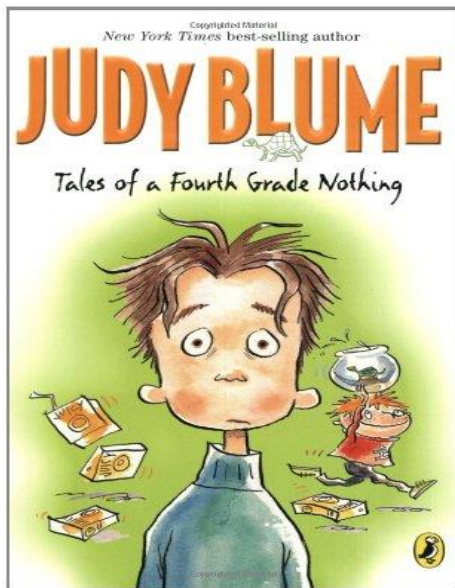
Tales of a Fourth Grade Nothing by Judy Blume (assessment- test)

Who Was Steve Irwin? by Dina Anastasio (assessment- test)

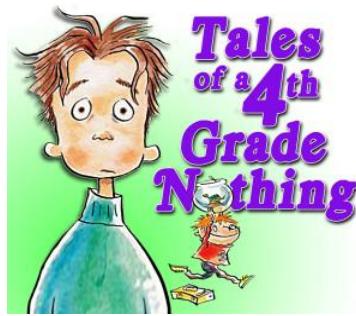
## #1. YOUR ASSIGNED FICTION SUMMER READING NOVEL & ASSIGNMENT:

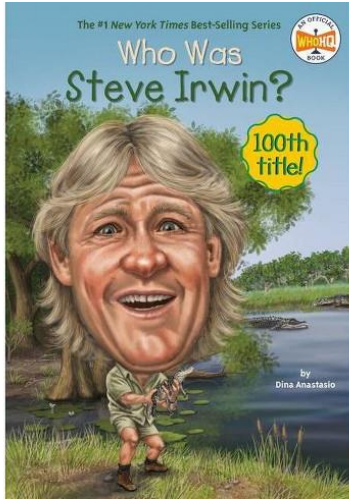
